WHAT WE DO

We are a hobby breeder of F2 Pomskeys who are constantly looking for ways to improve the quality of our breeding program through consideration for the genetic make up of our breeding pairs (sires and dams) as well as temperament of those parent dogs. In keeping close contact with our customers, we continue to learn about the behavior and nature of the puppies we produce.

In addition to our own Pomskey pets, we utilize guardian homes where place a pet who will remain as part of our breeding program, while enjoying life as part of their own family unit. When we assume the care of puppies born to guardian homes, they have been fully weaned and are a minimum eight weeks old before being separated from their mother.

While in our care, puppies make scheduled visits to our vet of choice, Hope Animal Clinic, Bessemer, AL. Puppies are well socialized through engagement with us and our adult dogs. By the time you pick up your puppy, he/she will have had exposure to several dozen other people and pets.

Puppies will be litter trained, and we will have started the process of crate training and leash training, based on the duration of their stay with us.

We generally only handle one full litter of puppies at a time (usually ten or less.)

OUR COMMITMENT TO YOU

This puppy (**Name**) is sold in good faith with no known life-threatening health problems and has been examined by a licensed Vet. Internal and external parasites like giardia, coccidia and intestinal worms are a normal occurrence in puppies and treatable.

Because puppies can easily pick up these issues, as well as viruses, we can only assure you that your puppy is up to date for age appropriate vaccinations and de-wormings. We strongly urge you to continue a vaccination schedule and avoid areas of dog traffic with your puppy until it has full immunity, which is after 16 weeks.

The breeder has taken all reasonable care to ensure that all pups produced are as healthy as possible. Cancers, foreign body ingestion, behavioral issues, accidents, ear infections and UTI's are considered normal occurrences and are not reason to return the puppy. Also, a puppy's bite (over/under) may change as the puppy develops, and therefore is not covered.

We offer a 24-month guarantee from the puppy's date of birth to original owner for all life-altering genetic diseases. We will reimburse you up to 100% of puppy purchase price; You do not have to return puppy. Written documentation from a licensed veterinarian, certification from Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA), and X-rays are required to support a diagnosis of moderate to severe hereditary genetic Hip Dysplasia.
